

Our literacy text this term

Literacy

This term we will be reading and exploring the text 'Animal Farm' by George Orwell.

Students will listen to and engage with the story, using the original text and adapted extracts. They will also watch extracts from the film.

This term students will be engaging with the text, exploring and describing the characters' thoughts, feelings, actions and motives. They will compare these to their own experiences and real-life contexts. They will also work on comprehension of the text, and expressing their ideas through group discussion.

Numeracy

Pupils will work on basic calculation skills, overlearning and reinforcing their skills. They will also work on measurement, including time and the properties of shapes.

At home, or when students are out in the community, please provide opportunities to tell the time, use money or to work out every day problems involving numbers.



Fundamentals For the Future (FFF)

We will continue to work on FFF skills in Literacy, Maths and Personal and Social Development. The personal skills are those that are important for an independent adult life and competence in the workplace. Children will be encouraged to work on these skills at home and in school.

Galleywood Market once a month will provide opportunities to use money in a practical setting, either making different amounts or working out change. It would be helpful if pupils have a small amount of money, **no more than £3** for these visits, so that they can select the correct coins for their purchases

All Different, All Equal Week

The term began with a themed week, during which students were encouraged to think about and discuss the diversity we have within our school, community and country as a whole.
