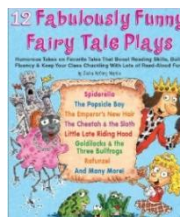
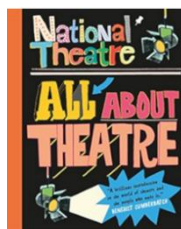


CLL

In CLL lessons we will be reading a range of **playscripts** as well as **The Lion King**. Learners will broaden their understanding of text types, build comprehension skills through reading activities. Written work will be based around each short playscript, focusing on core writing skills and using imagination and humour in written work.

Learners will develop speaking and listening skills through role play and build confidence in performing in preparation for the Winter Production.

Spellings will be given every week which will be practised in school and at home.



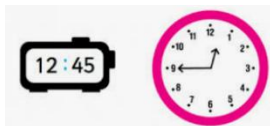
A highlight this term for all the students in Year 9 will be the *Winter Production*. Pupils will share their ideas and will work collaboratively to create, write and take part in the show in a variety of ways. Year 9 will be taking on the starring roles and the whole school will be involved.

Our **Topic Lessons** will be directly related to 'all things theatre'. We will learn about the history of theatre and cinema and consider how entertainment has changed over time and differences across the world. Pupils will have chance to share their own favourite films, actors and musicians and will create their own 'Thriftwood walk of fame' ahead of their big performance. They will consider the range of job roles within the industry, take a backstage tour at Chelmsford Theatre, participate in drama workshops and have the opportunity to see 'The Lion King' in London's West End.



Maths

In Maths pupils will continue to develop their understanding of number and place value. They will build on their knowledge of the four operations and begin to apply this to practical problems. Across the year there will be a strong focus on using money, telling the time and using measures (length, weight, capacity) in practical ways relevant to everyday life.



Science

The Science focus this term is **Health and Hygiene**. Pupils will start by learning about how our bodies are equipped to fight microbes, bacteria and viruses and discover ways in which we can prevent illness. They will then learn the science behind cooking and cleaning.

Careers

Pupils will begin to consider what it means to work and think about the reasons why work is an important part of life. They will hear from people in a range of job families and have opportunities throughout the year to experience different workplaces and start to think about their own strengths and skills. They will develop teamwork skills and practise appropriate workplace behaviours through various enterprise projects and workshops.

Other parts of our curriculum include:

- Twice Weekly *PE* lesson
- Weekly *Computing* lessons
- Weekly *PSHCE* lessons
- Fortnightly *Cookery* lessons
- Outdoor learning and community visits
- Independence and life skills
