Look after property

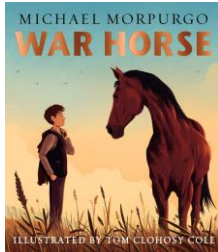
SCHOOL TRIP

Our Literacy text this term.

Literacy

This term we will be reading and exploring the theme of WW1 via War Horse by Michael Morpurgo.

Students will watch the film and will work with the story, using the original text, adapted extracts and film clips to improve their vocabulary and comprehension of the story. They will be encouraged to develop their writing skills through guided writing

A key focus for all students this term is to gain enjoyment from stories and reading and from sharing their thoughts through discussion.

Numeracy

We will work on confident recall of number bonds and mental addition and subtraction We will reinforce the understanding of place value.

Our key focus for this term is the use of money and to gain an understanding of credit and debit cards as payment methods. We will use cash in a practical setting, within the local community.

At home, or when out and about, please provide opportunities for your child talk about and use money, also to tell the time or work out problems involving time.



A highlight this term for all the students in Upper School will be the *School Performance*. Pupils will share their ideas and will work collaboratively to create, write and take part in the show in a variety of ways.
