



## Thriftwood School KS2/3 Parents Survey Results Feb 2026


**Do you receive an appropriate level of communication from the school via text, email, paper letters, notes in home school diaries, phone calls and information on the website?**




**We have an open-door policy at school; have all your questions, queries and communications been answered in a timely and appropriate manner?**




**Do you feel that you have enough opportunities throughout the year to engage with the life of the school? e.g. winter production, parents evenings, sports day, family picnic etc**

Helps my daughter with her need for routine in the mornings. It is flexible enough to adapt to her sensory and independence needs


Children don't compare with each other. Allows for easy dressing in the mornings. Shows respect and alliance with the school.

A sense of belonging to a community.


He looks smart and feels proud to be a student at the school

Showing there are rules and to promote being smartly dressed at a young age


**We offer coffee mornings, emails including links to parental events by charities and other organisations, and we have a strong pastoral team. Do you feel this is enough support for you as a parent?**
